ABOUT THE CALENDAR

<p>First Day of School for Students</p>	<p>10-month employees return on August 11th</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> PAACS payroll contract year for 10th month employees is August 10th to June 13th. All staff must return by August 11th and attend professional development before students return. <p>Students return before Labor Day</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Starting before Labor Day allows charter schools to meet Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) mandates, which require a minimum of 180 instructional days or 900 hours (elementary) / 990 hours (secondary) of instruction per year. An earlier start provides flexibility to accommodate holidays, professional development, and weather-related closures while ensuring compliance with these requirements. Additionally, it helps prevent summer learning loss and allows students to establish routines before high-stakes assessments.
<p>Last Day of School for Students</p>	<p>School ends by June 12th</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The 10-month payroll contract year ends on June 13th, so students and staff must attend school up to and including this date
<p>Religious/Cultural Celebrations</p>	<p>Weekend holidays will not be observed as days off, except when mandated by the State</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To meet the 180 school days requirement, only weekday holidays are observed <p>Indigenous Peoples' Days is a PD Day</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Having school employees work on Indigenous Peoples' Day while giving students the day off allows for valuable professional development, collaborative planning, and training without disrupting instructional time. This approach ensures that teachers and staff can engage in professional learning, curriculum development, and operational planning while students receive a well-deserved break. Additionally, it maintains flexibility in the school calendar to meet mandated instructional time requirements while honoring the significance of the day for students and families. <p>Midweek Closures</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Midweek closures for religious holidays allow students and staff to fully observe significant faith-based practices without academic conflicts. These closures promote inclusivity, respect, and equity while preventing disruptions from absenteeism. Recognizing holidays on their actual dates demonstrates cultural awareness and supports a diverse, inclusive school community.
<p>Professional Development</p>	<p>New Staff, Teacher Induction & August Academy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> New staff require professional development days to introduce the school's culture, policies, procedures, and expectations. These additional days provide time for thorough training on curriculum, technology, and classroom management, as well as an opportunity to build relationships with colleagues. This year we will have teachers who will be in both the First Year Induction Program and the Second Year Induction Program. Participating in this Induction Program is a requirement when applying for Level II certification. Returning staff are familiar with the school's routines but still benefit from extra time to update their skills, learn about any changes (such as curriculum or policy updates), and engage in team-building activities. The PD days for them allow for deeper professional growth and preparation for the upcoming school year. <p>Additional PD Days</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Additional PD days throughout the year allow staff to continuously develop their skills, reflect on their practices, and collaborate with colleagues. These days help address emerging challenges, stay updated with best practices, and allow for the provision of ongoing professional development. Regular PD opportunities foster ongoing growth, ultimately benefiting both educators and students.
<p>Early Dismissals</p>	<p>Data Days</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> These early dismissals for students give instructional staff dedicated time to consistently review and analyze student data, allowing them to identify trends, assess progress, and adjust teaching strategies accordingly. This regular, focused time fosters collaboration

and ensures that educators can make data-driven decisions to improve instruction, address student needs, and support better outcomes throughout the year. These day also offer the opportunity to provide specific, targeted SEL afterschool activities to our students who need it the most.

Student Community Meetings

- Using a scheduled early dismissal day for community meetings allows schools to dedicate focused time for fostering strong relationships and addressing key social-emotional topics. It provides students with an opportunity to engage in meaningful conversations without the pressure of academic tasks. By setting aside this time, students can build connections with peers, discuss important school values, and reflect on their experiences, creating a supportive and inclusive school culture. The structured time also ensures that staff can guide these discussions effectively, promoting a positive environment for students while also allowing for an efficient wrap-up of the school day.

Staff Early Dismissals Prior to Holiday

- Dismissing staff early before a holiday or break is a great way to show appreciation for their hard work and to allow them time to prepare for the upcoming time off. It offers employees a chance to relax, decompress, and enjoy quality time with family or friends without the pressure of work.

Report Card Conferences

- Early dismissals for students during report card conferences allow teachers and parents to have dedicated time for meaningful discussions about a student's progress. This scheduling ensures that parents can attend conferences without conflicting with regular school hours, leading to more thorough and productive conversations. It also gives teachers time to focus on individual student needs, providing personalized feedback and setting goals for improvement. Additionally, it reduces classroom disruptions, ensuring a more focused and engaging environment during the conferences. Early dismissals for these events promote strong home-school partnerships and support student growth.

Half Days During Last Week of School

- Early dismissals during the last week of school provide a chance to wrap up the year in a relaxed, organized manner. It allows teachers and staff time to finalize grades, prepare classrooms for the next year, and conduct end-of-year activities without feeling rushed. For students, it offers a smooth transition into the summer break, reducing stress and providing time to reflect on their accomplishments. Early dismissals also allow families to begin their summer plans or travel. Overall, it helps create a positive end to the school year, promoting both academic reflection and well-being.

Winter Break

10 days off for Winter Break

- A 10-day winter break for students and staff provides ample time for rest, relaxation, and rejuvenation. It helps prevent burnout by allowing everyone to recharge after the first part of the school year. This extended break supports mental and physical well-being, which in turn can improve productivity, focus, and overall morale when school resumes. Additionally, it gives families the opportunity to spend quality time together during the holiday season. For staff, it offers time to prepare for the second semester, reflect on teaching strategies, and return to work refreshed and ready to tackle new challenges.

Miscellaneous

Annual Back to School Party in August

- It is important for all staff to attend the Annual Back to School Party because it fosters a sense of unity and collaboration among the team. This event provides an opportunity for staff to connect outside of the classroom or office, strengthening interpersonal relationships and building a positive school culture. It also sets a welcoming tone for the upcoming school year, showing a shared commitment to the success of students and the school community. By attending, staff can model a sense of enthusiasm and school spirit, which can positively impact student engagement and morale.

Back to School Night in September

- Back to School Night is important because it creates an opportunity for parents, students, and teachers to connect and set expectations for the upcoming school year. It allows parents to meet their child's teachers, learn about the curriculum, and understand classroom policies and procedures. This event fosters open communication between families and the school, strengthening the home-school partnership. For students, it provides a chance to show their parents their school environment and feel supported by

both their educators and family. Ultimately, Back to School Night sets the tone for a successful, collaborative year ahead.

Family Nights and Schoolwide Activities

- While there are some evening events that require all staff to support with their presence like the ones mentioned above, there are other evening events that are voluntary for staff. These family focused events include but are not limited to: October Reading Celebration, Family Bingo Night, Family Movie Night, Black History Talent Show, Family Game Night, and Fiesta Fusion. There are other events that occur after school hours that help to celebrate our students' success. These student celebrations include but are not limited to: PBIS trimester award activities and Readers Red Carpet.
